

'Liar Moon reaches the UK more than ten years after its original publication. Italy in 1943 presents an unusual historical-political background. The Allies have invaded the South, Mussolini has been deposed, but in the North the Nazis are still in control.

A prominent fascist in Verona is murdered. Stationed there, reluctantly, is major Martin Bora—a German aristocrat with a conscience. He's obliged to investigate, together with the local police inspector, Sandro Guidi, who is also seeking a serial killer.

The relationship between the two men, as their inquiries develop, is at the crux of this impressive and intelligent novel.'
